



## Gerald "Jerry" Ferraro

September 14, 1942 - May 1, 2020

Gerald "Jerry" Ferraro, age 77, lost his fight with Alzheimer's disease & passed away peacefully on May 1, 2020, at the David Simpson Hospice House in Cleveland. Jerry was the only child born to Jim & Catherine Ferraro on September 14, 1942. He graduated from Cathedral Latin high school in 1960. Jerry was an Army Veteran, enlisting in 1964, serving 2 terms of service. Jerry met his bride-to-be, Carol (nee: Koziol) in 1962 & this would be the start of their lifelong love affair - married in 1966, they had 3 children Lori, Jim, Nicole. Jerry had a passion for everything sports & played basketball & baseball until his mid 50's at which time he fell in love with golf. You could regularly find him working on his swing - hitting balls in mid-winter with chilling temps. Jerry was the proud "Papa" to Cooper & Zoe Allison & enjoyed attending their school & sports activities.

Jerry retired from The Plain Dealer after 42 years & continued helping others as a driver for LakeTran, where he officially retired after 8 years of service. Jerry had a generous & loving heart with every person he met. He had a great sense of humor & a unique phrase for every situation, i.e., we were regularly warned: "don't get caught in the trick bag". Jerry had a nickname for everyone & made you feel special. He was incredibly humble & never stopped learning, including changing his first diaper in 2001. Jerry was devoted to his family & always there to listen or lend a hand. You would regularly hear him refer to his "Blondie" even in his final days. Jerry truly was one of kind & his legacy will live on in each person that he touched, especially within the heart & soul of his family.
