Ralph M. Satterfield, age 84 of Madison, died Wednesday, December 9, 2020 at the home he and his wife, Laurelie built in 1973. He was born July 1, 1936 in Fairmont, West Virginia.

Ralph is a veteran of the United States Marine Corps. He was also a life member of the Elks 549 in Painesville, American Legion Local Post 112, a 32nd Degree member of the Masonic Lodge 307 in Madison and the Al Koran Shrine.

Ralph worked for the Austin Company for many years and was a Labor Foreman for Laborer's Local 310. After retiring from Local 310, he and Laurelie opened a Travel Agents International franchise in 1987 which allowed them to travel extensively.
