



## Scott C. Corniuk

Scott C. Corniuk, age 63, of Mentor, died Friday, May 8, 2020, at Hillcrest Hospital, Mayfield Heights, OH. He was born November 13, 1956, in Warren, MI.

Mr. Corniuk was an engineering salesman in the hydraulics and pneumatics industry as well as the owner of a local comic book and sports card shop, Sports'N'More. His keen eye, discerning intellect, and creative problem solving will be missed in the business community.

Scott was a voracious reader, particularly of fantasy and science fiction. His appetite for reading was surpassed only by his thirst for knowledge. He was a lifelong learner, encouraging those around him to do the same. The comic book shop was born of his hobby of collecting sci-fi/fantasy stories in graphic format and wanting to share his hobby with others while at the same time teaching business to his children and, later, grandchildren. Scott was also a skilled and accomplished woodworker, often helping and amazing family and friends with his handiwork. He was a beloved father, friend, grandfather, colleague, and employer who was always willing to help others out and provide guidance toward achieving greater things.
