Mrs. Clapp passed away December 14, 2015 at Fairmount Health Center. She was born January 14, 1917 in Duluth, Minnesota. Anne had lived in Pepper Pike before moving to Kirtland in 1968.

Mrs. Clapp was a member of the Valley Lutheran Church in Chagrin Falls, a former trustee of Case Western Reserve University, Andrews School, Holden Arboretum and the Willoughby Fine Arts.
