Cora F. Goldsworth, 96, of Mentor passed away, March 1, 2016 at Mapleview Country Villa in Chardon OH. Cora was born on May 25, 1919 in Sag Harbor, New York.

On April 3, 1948 she married Elmer “Goldy” Goldsworth, living in DeWitt NY for 50 years.

Cora loved cross-stitching, embroidery, beading and was a member of the Embroidery Guild of New York. Her talent won her many ribbons and best of shows for her needlework at the New York State Fair.

Cora was also a member of The Bonsai Society of New York and owned nearly 150 Bonsai trees. She and her husband were fortunate enough to have studied under Master Bonsai Cultivator, John Naka.

In 2010 Cora moved to Mentor to be closer to her family.

She was a loving and devoted wife, mother, grandmother and great-grandmother. Survivors include her sons, John (Jane) of Southport, NC and Neal (Gail) of Mentor. Grandsons, Andrew (Caitlin Duffy) of New York, NY and Daniel (Laurel) of Mentor, and great-grandson, Elliot Goldsworth of Mentor.
