Grant O. Provins, age 77, of Mentor, passed away Tuesday, December 20, 2022 at Burton Health Care Center, Burton, OH after a 12-year battle with Parkinson's disease. He was born March 28, 1945 in Cleveland.

Mr. Provins was a retired Controls Engineer who traveled across the globe for work. Blessed with an engineer's mind and a salesman's personality, he was often called upon to finalize large projects on behalf of the company because of his unique skillset.
