Jack D. Babb, age 86 of Mentor, passed away peacefully surrounded by his family, August 3, 2019 at Concord Village Skilled Nursing and Rehabilitation Center. He was born on March 3, 1933 in Hagerstown, MD.

He served in the U.S. Navy as a 3rd class petty officer and quartermaster during the Korean War aboard the USS Donner. 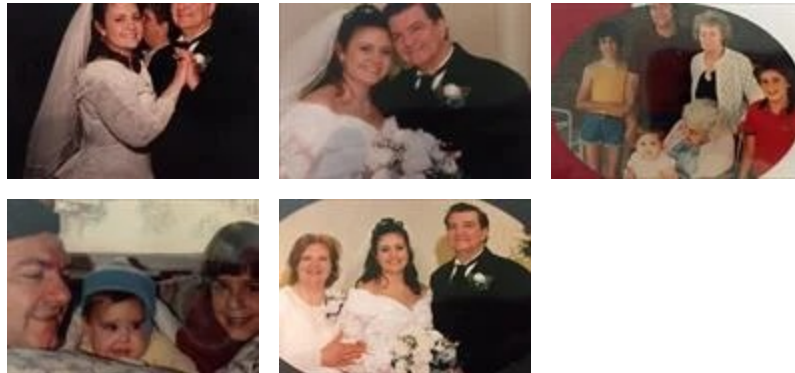
