James "Jim/Jimmy" H. Lyons Jr., 76, of Mentor, peacefully passed away August 4, 2023 at Symphony of Mentor, with his family by his side. He was born February 4, 1947 in Cleveland to the late James H. and Lillian A. Lyons.

They were very close, and he was very protective of his baby sister. Dad also liked to go to mixers, where he would eventually meet the love of his life, Jane.

Jane had a passion for art and Dad was passionate about Jane. They met in 1986, and his life was forever changed. They married and lived a full life. She opened the world to him, and she was his world. They traveled, they built a home, created a business, and explored life and learning together. They took classes in art together, raised several kitties together, and enjoyed time spent together, always. Life forever changed for Dad in 1995 when Jane passed. His love for Jane was never ending.

Dad lived out his days, after Jane's passing, loving his family and trying to be the best version of himself that he could be. Dad was blessed with Brenna, Joshua, Brittney and Emma. Dad bestowed his love for video games and love for all things sci-fi onto his grandchildren, who he loved with his whole heart. He also loved his great grandchildren, Evelyn Rose and Michael Philip.
