James P. Koerner, 74, of Mentor, Ohio passed away surrounded by his loving family on Sunday, January 19, 2025 at University Hospitals Tri-Point Medical Center, Concord, OH.

Jim was born on September 1, 1950 in Pittsburgh, PA to the late Victor and Martha Koerner.

Mr. Koerner earned a bachelor's degree from DePauw University in 1972 and a law degree from Ohio Northern University Pettit College of Law in 1975. He began his legal career serving as an assistant prosecutor with the Lake County Prosecutor's office. He later transitioned to a private law practice and was a practicing attorney until his retirement in January of 2024. He served as Bar Counsel for the Lake County Bar Association for many years, and was the 2019 recipient of the Lake County Bar Association's President's Award.

Jim will be remembered for his kindness, empathy and dry sense of humor, which was with him until the very end.
