Jamison Bennett Stenoien, 56, of Euclid, found complete rest and wholeness with His sweet Savior, Jesus, on Thursday, December 18, 2025.

He was born at Mather AFB on October 6, 1969, and spent most of his childhood in Bridgeport and Manson, Washington.

Jamison served in the US Air Force from 1988-1993, where he was a Tactical Air Command and Control Specialist (Parachutist). After serving in the Air Force, he served in the Air National Guard for several years.

For the last 10 years, Jamison was a dialysis nurse at Midtown Dialysis in Cleveland, Ohio, where he loved serving other veterans. He cared immensely for his patients and coworkers.

Jamison has been a faithful member of Grace Church of Mentor since 2000 and loved well his brothers and sisters in Christ. He will always be remembered for his deep love of Jesus and the Bible, constant prayer for others, and ability to care for family, friends, and even strangers in very personal ways. His hobbies included spending time with his family, eating, working on cars, being in nature, "treasure" hunting, picking mulberries, making unique culinary concoctions, baking for others, and scrolling on OLA for the best deals.
