John Pierce, PhD, age 86, of Mentor, passed Friday, Jan. 11, 2013. He was born Sept. 6, 1926, in Lakewood.

He was one of four children of Lena Grafton and Clyde Pierce. John grew up in Painesville and retired in Mentor. He is survived by his wife, Lillian Pierce; daughter, Dawn Pierce; brother, Frank Pierce, PhD; three nieces; and seven nephews.

He left University life for opportunities in advertising, where he received many awards and finally retired from Liggett-Stashower in Cleveland in 1988.

His greatest joy was volunteering for over 40 years in both Cleveland's Project: LEARN and Painesville's ABLE, helping people get their GED's and assisting all students to improve their skills. John was a longtime blood and organ donor.
