Joseph F. Koslo, aka Kozoglow, 90, a resident of Mentor since 1963, died Oct. 6, 2013, at Lake Health West Medical Center in Willoughby. Born Nov. 11, 1922, in Cleveland, Mr. Koslo had retired after 25 years as a warehouse supervisor for Dalton Industries.
