Juliet Nora Anne Gardini (née Prioreshi) a longtime resident of Chardon, OH, passed away October 30, 2016 at the age of 96. She was the daughter of immigrants from Italy, Alessio and Giovanni (née Cattani) Prioreshi. Beloved wife of Hugo Romeo Gardini (deceased); loving mother of Edward (Miki) Gardini, Raymond Gardini, and Dolores (Jim) Scozzie; dearest grandmother of Michael Gardini, Chris (Barb) Scozzie, Nicole (John) Dehner, Cassandra (Tom) Hallet; cherished great-grandmother of six. Loving sister to her 9 siblings who preceded her in death: Angelo, Anthony, Charles, Louis, Romeo-her twin, Eugene, Mary, Ernestine, and Rose. She grew up in East Cleveland and attended Shaw High School. Despite growing up during the depression and World War II, Juliet was ever the optimist, and she believed it took only one Prioreshi to have a party. One can only imagine what it was like when all ten siblings were under the same roof at the same time. She was a fun and loving aunt, great aunt, and friend to many. Her life revolved around her family. She will be remembered for that love of family, her sense of humor and her enjoyment of life which included much cooking, laughing, singing and dancing. Juliet had a quiet and strong faith. She believed in the power of prayer and was devoted to praying the rosary. She also loved playing the lottery, bingo and an occasional trip to the casinos. Juliet was fiercely independent and was blessed with a very strong work ethic, working at many jobs in her long life, the last being thirteen years as a school crossing guard. Juliet was 84 when she retired from the South Euclid Lyndhurst School District. She will be

missed by her children, grandchildren, great-grandchildren, many nieces, nephews and grand -nieces and -nephews.
