July 28, 1918 - August 6, 2018

Margery (Lecrone) Gregg, 100 of Amsterdam, OH for most of her adult life, passed away on Monday, August 6, 2018 at Tripoint Medical Center in Concord Township, OH after a brief illness. She was born July 28, 1918 near Bucyrus, OH.

Margery's devotion to education developed as a student in the Holmes-Liberty schools, at Bluffton College, and as a dedicated teacher at Springfield Local High School. Margie became an adult student in the Academy of Lifetime Learning and the Chautauqua Literary and Scientific Circle.
