August 3, 1972 - January 29, 2023

Martin (Marty) Puussaar, 50, of Mentor passed away at MetroHealth Medical Center in Cleveland, on January 29, 2023, after a short illness he valiantly fought.

He was born August 3, 1972 in Cleveland and was a graduate of Eastern Michigan University.

Marty loved his family and had a great sense of humor, always observing what was ironic or comical in any situation. He was a true “Car Guy,” who had amazing knowledge of vehicles, especially his vintage 912 Porsche. Marty liked all things Estonian, a well pressed, button down shirt and old TV shows from the 70’s. He appreciated a well-cut lawn, was an avid camper and enjoyed sharing memes and arguing political stances with his friends on social media. Model boat building was one of his passions, and of the many boats he completed, his most impressive creation was his remote-controlled sailboat, the Fairwind. We will always remember Marty’s great heart, that he was a good friend and neighbor who was always willing to give an encouraging word or help anyone in need.

He is survived by son, Sam Puussaar; daughter, Elmiire “Emmi” Puussaar; mother, Erika Puussaar (nee: Kikut); longtime love, Lynn Lancy; ex-wife, Linda Baily; aunt and Godmother, Silva Butterer; uncle Aksi (Rene) Kikut; close

friend, David Baily; faithful canine companion, Riley (Rilo P), and many other loving family members and friends.

Preceding Marty in death was his father, Aavo Puusaar, just this past December.

“ I have so many things I want to say about Marty Puusaar.



I met him through mutual friends around 1995, and I was unsure about my direction. My future wife was going off to Bowling Green. My younger brother was going off to Ohio State. I was still attending Lakeland, taking classes, with no idea what to do next.

Marty is the person who convinced me to get a direction. He had gone off to a little school in Michigan, and said it was far enough way to get a fresh start, close enough to return. When I left Ohio, it was Marty who picked me up and took me to my new chapter.

At college, we explored the campus, and he was my guide then. We biked the campus and woods, we went to trendy college places, we drove back and forth to other cities. We kayaked at a cabin and once almost capsized into a frozen lake. I didn't have a jacket then, and he let me borrow an extra one.

Over the first year, when my girlfriend came to visit, we stayed at Marty's apartment. I couldn't have a car at campus, so he drove mine. I probably saw him every single day of those 2 school years, and he was a rock. This is how I remember Marty Puusaar - as a college kid from the mid-90s.

He was done a year before me and the last drive from college, I was traveling through Cleveland when it hit me — this was it, this was the end of our run together. I said so, and he looked at me and said, “We'll always be friends.”

We were both correct. He returned to Ohio, and I stayed in Michigan. I really only saw him a few more times afterward - in passing, at his wedding, and then at my wedding. We got jobs, then he had kids, then I had kids, and years passed. We kept in touch with phone calls at first, then email, and then suddenly, he popped

up on social media.

It was great to hear from him again. We chatted about the old days and made plans to see each other again. I joked that I could finally return his jacket. I didn't know he was sick and was positive we had plenty of time. We did not.

25 years since college, I still play darts on a board Marty gave me. It's hanging next to a souvenir German license plate that Marty gave me. When I tell stories about my college days, it's the years with Marty. Oddly, his jacket is the first thing in my closet. I think about Marty all the time.

I'll really miss you, Marty.
