“ When I was 15 and living in Massachusetts I ran away from home. I took a train to Manhattan and upon arriving at Grand Central Station, I took a cab to Weezer's apartment in the East Village. I didn't have enough money to pay the cab driver so I managed to get through the double doors and went up to the 8th floor to get the money for the cab. Weezer wasn't home and the cab driver waited awhile and left. About two hours later Weezer got off the elevator and was shocked to see me standing there. Of course she called my parents to tell them where I was, but I did get to spend the weekend before going back on the train. I was planning on living with her but that idea did not excite her!

I took many trips to NYC over the past 50 years and we shopped, visited cheese shops, cooked, sewed, made jewelry and had great times and made great memories. She was my best friend and the one I could always lean on for support. When I lived in Ft. Lee, NJ, we had the chance to see each other more regularly since we were just across the GW Bridge from one another. We traveled to Italy together a few years ago and spent a lot of time together in Boca Raton and Orlando over these many years.

Weezer spent the majority of the holidays with my family, joining us in Puerto Rico, Montana, Massachusetts and all the many other places we lived when my Dad was in the Air Force. And my sons and I visited her wherever she was, repairing and repainting her condos as needed.

My granddaughter still has the dresses Weezer made her when she was little and she still remembers Weezer taught her to be sure to keep tissues in her handbag. Weezer will be missed more than we can express in words.

Her friends in Orlando whom she met while visiting plan to have a memorial for her to remember her and the joy she brought us. We all pray that she be at peace with her parents and sisters in heaven.
