Pete J. Magnino, 89, of Concord Twp., passed away October 14, 2022 at TriPoint Medical Center. He was born March 20, 1933 in Oklahoma to the late Pete and Ester Magnino.

Pete grew up on a farm in Oklahoma and carried his interest in agriculture through a Master's degree from Oklahoma State University and a Ph.D. degree from the University of Wisconsin. His career as a food scientist, for which he was awarded many patents, spanned several corporations, including Lubrizol. Pete was also a veteran of the US Army.

Pete was an avid sports fan with an encyclopedic knowledge of teams and players, especially in baseball. He was proud of his family heritage and spent time researching the family genealogy. He enjoyed photography and the outdoors and liked to spend time on the beaches of Lake Erie.

Survivors include his wife of 60 years, Donna D. Magnino; daughter, Lisa (Jon Coifman) Magnino; grandson, Alexander Coifman; sister, Lue (Jerry) Bryant and many nieces, nephews and other loving family members.

Preceding Pete in death are his siblings, Katherine Childers, AJ Magnino and Christina Watson.

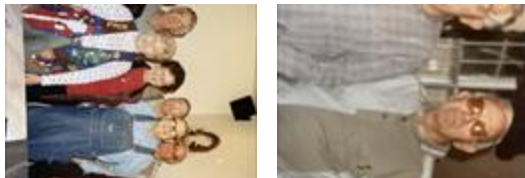
