Richard Martin Somerfeldt, 84, of Painesville, Ohio, passed away on February 28, 2025. He was born on September 21, 1940, in Schenectady, New York.

Richard attended Pennsylvania State University and achieved a Bachelor of Science in Engineering with a major in Metallurgy and a Masters in Material Science. In 1988, he left GE to become an entrepreneur and started his own automotive parts redistribution business.
