He'd spring for lunch, help you tackle a problem with a project or work, ask how your family was, talk movies, current events, etc. He always was interested in what we thought. He was interesting and interested.

He would hear us talking about sports, namely baseball, and would happily join the conversation, debating and detailing what player was better, which pitcher was garbage, etc. We'd talk batting averages, earned run averages, scores and stats all the time. He even took us to games at the old dungeon Municipal Stadium, picked us up, bought the tickets and food. He was beyond gracious. You could tell it made him happy.

I'll never forget him playing songs on his radio and singing along, inviting us to join in. You'd think he'd invented karaoke. It was hysterical. His zest for life was unmatched.

After I learned of his passing, I went to YouTube and listened one particular song Russ wailed to (though actually having fun, he tore it up, with good voice quality) and couldn't stop smiling and laughing. That's what he inspired in me, and, I'm quite sure, others—good times and good feelings.

I hadn't seen him for a long time, but never forgot him. When he did leave the commission, I remember being truly salty. But he kept in touch always, popping in, teasing us, telling jokes and always, always laughing.

So, rest easy, my man, Russ. The indelible marks you made in the lives you touched will never fade. Ever. You were unequivocally one of the good guys.
