Stanley W. Streiner, age 92 of Mentor, passed away June 4, 2020, at his residence. He was born July 28, 1927, in Cleveland, OH to the late August "Gus" and Rose Streiner.

Stan worked as an accountant for GE at the Nela Park office. As a U.S. Navy WWII veteran, he served aboard the USS Stansbury, USS Shangri La, and the USS Lexington. He enjoyed being active and staying in shape. Stan was well-known for his sense of humor and the re-telling of bad jokes. He was a longtime member of St. Mary of the Assumption Catholic Church, serving as a Eucharistic minister and lector. He also had been a former Director of the Cleveland Chapter of the Blue Army of Our Lady of Fatima, based at St. Paul's Shrine in Cleveland.
