



Thomas Joseph "Tom" Gilligan III

April 7, 1945 - April 27, 2017

Thomas Joseph "Tom" Gilligan III of Mentor, OH died on Thursday, April 27, 2017 at age 72 in Parma, OH after a long illness. He was born in 1945 in Great Barrington, MA to Dr. and Mrs. Thomas J. Gilligan Jr., and was the eldest of 9 children. He was a car guy in high school and very proud of his Pontiac GTO and working in the pit crew of the "200", which raced at Lebanon Valley Speedway. In college, he worked one summer driving cement trucks so he could read and study while waiting in line. His love of reading and learning continued throughout his life. He graduated with a bachelor's of chemistry from College of the Holy Cross in 1967, and received a Masters and PhD from Yale University in electrochemistry in 1972.

While a fellow at the University of Oklahoma, he met Connie Carole McCrory and married her in 1973 in Little Rock, Arkansas. They moved to Switzerland while he was a fellow at the Max Planck Institute at the University of Basel. Returning to the US, they had two daughters and settled in Lake County, Ohio where he started working for Diamond Shamrock as a Sr. Research Chemist. He retired from Eltech Systems Corporation in 2000 as Vice President of Emerging Business and CTO, having collaborated on teams that were awarded five US patents and more than 50 patents in other countries, mostly in the field of electrochemistry. After his first retirement, he became an Adjunct Professor of Chemical Engineering at Case Western Reserve University and started the GC Group, a consulting firm.

Tom believed in giving back to the community, volunteering as a science fair judge and on the Board of the Northeast Ohio Scouting for the Boy Scouts. He was a wonderful husband and father who enjoyed cooking for his family. He made the best Thanksgiving dinners and apple pie. Enjoying traveling and studying other countries, Tom and Carole made many trips to Europe and Asia. Every summer he took the family on vacations to the beach and to Cedar Point to ride roller coasters. These were a favorite because of the special times with his daughters. He loved sports--rooting for the Indians and Cavs. Tom was definitely not a fair weather fan. Tom's frequent trips to the Cleveland Art Museum, Symphony and Botanical Gardens were shared enthusiastically with family. "Papa Tom's" grandchildren were a delight to him especially at Christmas when decorating cookies for Santa.

He is survived by his wife, Connie Carole Gilligan of Mentor, OH, daughters Heather Gilligan of Houston, TX and Megan Tillman (Christopher) of Sagamore Hills, OH, grandchildren Brandon and Lauren, siblings Michele Gilligan (Les Ettlinger) of Great Barrington, MA, Peter Gilligan (Lynn Smiley) of Chapel Hill, NC, Susan Lucy (Robert) of Fallbrook, CA, Ann Gilligan (Steve Seitz) of Swarthmore, PA, Jane Gilligan (Don Ritcher) of Lenox, MA, Paul Gilligan (Joyce Fitzpatrick) of Northborough, MA, Hannah Gilligan of Arlington, MA and Michael Gilligan (Elizabeth) of Durham, NC and many nieces, nephews and cousins. He is predeceased by his parents Thomas J. Gilligan Jr. and Mary Hassett Gilligan.

My deep condolences to Tom's family members, relatives, and friends. I am Tom's classmate from the College of the Holy Cross, Worcester, MA but, most unfortunately, missed out on the opportunity to get to know him during my first two years of college (I then transferred Stanford University in CA to major in Psychology). I would have loved to talk science with him. In a more general way, I did try to get Tom to vote for me in our sophomore year (1964-1965) when I ran for the elected office of Secretary for the Class of 1967 (my classy but doomed slogan was "Vote for McGovernment!"). I do not know how Tom voted, but I did learn that I shared a common fate with another McGovern, George McGovern (Dove), who lost to the incumbent Tricky Dick Nixon (Hawk) in 1972. My campaign manager was another classmate of Tom, Chas. A. Domson of Mahanoy City, PA who, like Tom, went on to earn his Ph.D. at Yale University (in the History of Science). Charlie Domson died young, but I do hope that he got to know Tom during both his years at the Cross (as opposed to being "on the Cross!") and at Yale (Charlie lived in Jonathan Edwards College at Yale). Charlie's Ph.D. advisor at Yale was Peter Gay, a scholar whom Tom may have read given his great interest in the natural sciences. Tom had a wonderful life, though cut short prematurely. He had a nourishing love life and was blessed with both daughters and grandchildren. His work life was something in which he thrived. I am very sorry for your great loss - it would have been nice to possibly get to know Tom a bit at our upcoming 50th Class Reunion at Holy Cross this coming June 2017. I shall keep him in my prayers, as I am sure will many of his college classmates.
